

- Tell others what you learned at One Earth Film Fest: word of mouth, social media, in an op-ed or letter to the editor

- Change your mindset: Everything you do is related to the ecosystem!
- Spend more time in nature
- Join an eco- or climate justice group in your community; volunteer to protect our planet
- Lend support & resources to BIPOC and low-income communities disproportionately impacted by our climate crisis
- Support Black and Indigenous nature protectors with your voice, time, and dollars
- Support local food policy initiatives
- Support local organic farmers, buy organic, join a coop, shop at farmer markets
- Make space for those whose access to farms, gardens, and green spaces have been cut off due to environmental racism

- Cut down on your individual and household beef consumption; eat at least one plant-based meal per week, and increase to per day
- Speak up around injustices; teach the next generation
- Understand the link between climate change and the global beef trade and the hidden costs of burgers
- Review the action toolkit from the Patrol film team
- Demand transparency in supply chains for beef and other commodities linked to deforestation
- Combat misinformation about climate change
- Be a leader: build a network, create content, join a board, run for office
- Contact your legislators with a letter or group letter about the Forest Act & VOTE for candidates with strong environmental platforms
- In IL, join the IEC April 30 Conservation Lobby Day
- Draw down carbon through forest protection and indigenous peoples' forest tenure
