

FROM FILMMAKER - There is no one top action, we need a rehaul of the way we live with the planet and each other. Electing officials with climate as a top priority helps, as does eating and buying local, but this crisis is an existential one that questions who we are as people.

Encourage city officials to reach out to agencies like the EPA to take advantage of grant programs like Brownfields which revitalize and remediate environmentally hazardous areas. <u>epa.gov/brownfields</u>
